**Exercise 42.** Let 
$$M := \begin{pmatrix} 2 & 2 & 6 & 3 \\ 5 & 4 & 8 & 5 \\ 8 & 2 & 0 & 6 \\ 0 & 5 & 1 & 7 \end{pmatrix}$$
 Is  $M$  invertible? If so, compute the adjoint matrix of and the inverse  $M^{-1}$ . Check that  $M: M^{-1}$  is the identity matrix.
